Title IX Sexual Harassment

- Sexual Assault (as defined by the Clery Act)
- Dating Violence
- Domestic Violence
- Stalking

(as defined by Violence Against Women Act)

Jurisdiction

- The conduct is alleged to have occurred on or after August 14, 2020;
- The conduct is alleged to have occurred in the United States;
- The conduct is alleged to have occurred in UConn's education program or activity; and
- The alleged conduct, if true, would constitute covered sexual harassment as defined in this policy.
- The complainant must be participating in or attempting to participate in a University education program or activity at the time the complaint is filed.





Appeals

- To determine whether the administrative hearing was conducted in conformity with
 prescribed procedures giving the complainant and investigating Student Conduct officer
 a reasonable opportunity to prepare and to present information that *The Student*Code was violated, and giving the respondent a reasonable opportunity to prepare and
 to present a response to those allegations.
- To determine whether the sanction(s) imposed were appropriate for the determined violation(s) of The Student Code.
- To consider new information, sufficient to alter a decision, or other relevant facts not brought out in the original hearing, because such information and/or facts were not known to the person appealing at the time of the original administrative hearing.

Title IX Sexual Harassment Cases



Resolution

Required Live Administrative Hearing

Dismissals

Mandatory

- When jurisdiction can't be met for Title IX (I.e. location of alleged incident)
- Does permit an appeal
- Does permit Community Standards to investigate under the student conduct process

Discretionary

- The complainant withdraws their complaint
- The respondent is no longer enrolled
- Specific circumstances prevent
 UConn from gathering evidence
 sufficient to reach a determination
 regarding the Formal Complaint
- Does permit an appeal

Appeals

- To determine whether the administrative hearing was conducted in conformity with prescribed procedures giving the complainant and investigating student conduct officer a reasonable opportunity to prepare and to present information that The Student Code was violated and giving the respondent a reasonable opportunity to prepare and to present a response to those allegations.
- To determine whether the sanction(s) imposed were appropriate for the determined violation(s) of The Student Code.
- To consider new information, sufficient to alter a decision, or other relevant facts not brought out in the original hearing, because such information and/or facts were not known to the person appealing at the time of the original administrative hearing.
- The Title IX Coordinator, investigator(s), or decision-maker(s) had a conflict of interest or bias for or against an individual party, or for or against complainants or respondents in general, that affected the outcome of the matter.
