- Campus Climate
 - How are students truly feeling? What can the University do better to make students feel safe?
- General mistrust as it pertains to the handling of sexual assault cases
 - Administration & UCPD
- Sense of direction after cases occur
 - Where do students go in different cases? How do they know who to speak with?
- Resource accessibility
 - What are the available resources? How can we make them more readily available?
